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Active Shooter/Hostile Event Response (ASHER) | 8 hours (Saturday OR Sunday)

NFPA 3000™ (PS) identifies the minimum program elements needed to organize, manage, and sustain an active shooter and/or hostile event response program. The ASHER program includes topics that will assist in the reduction or elimination of the risks, the effects, and the impact on an organization or community affected by these events. ASHER also addresses the following areas of NFPA 3000: Planning, assessing risks, developing community-wide programs, responding, establishing competencies communicating to all stakeholders recovering, planning recovery efforts, and taking into account healthcare and mental health issues.

Basic Fire Attack | 16 hours (Saturday-Sunday)

The purpose behind this 16-hour course is to familiarize the student with the basics of fire behavior and live fire attack. Student will be required to demonstrate the correct procedures necessary to extinguish a class A fire utilizing the direct, indirect or combination attack. This will be a physically demanding course; student will be required to function as part of a team and crew leader inside an IDLH environment.

Beyond Hoses & Helmets | 16 hours (Saturday-Sunday)

This course is designed for chief officers, directors, commissioners, and emerging fire officers of organizations which are staffed by volunteer, part-time, paid on-call, and/or career personnel.

Honor Guard | 24 hours (Thursday-Saturday)

This course is designed for both current and potential Honor Guard members. The course will include classroom instruction on subjects such as flag etiquette and line of duty funeral procedures as well as hands-on training with emphasis on close order drill. The course is 40 hours and will conclude with participation in the Alabama Fire College Firefighter I/II recruit graduation ceremony.

Incident Safety Officer (NFA) | 16 hours (Saturday-Sunday)

This two-day course examines the Safety Officer's role at emergency responses, and focuses on operations within an Incident Command System (ICS) as a Safety Officer and emphasizes response to all-hazards types of situations.

National Fire Incident Reporting System | 8 hours (Saturday OR Sunday)

This course is designed to allow the fire service an opportunity to collect, collate, separate, and clearly define the parameters of service requests. A (4) hour course that allows the individual participant to get a basic understanding of the importance and ease of reporting activities that all fire service entities are requested and/or required to do on a daily basis. This information is used by the USFA to set up grant programs to assist local responders through the AFG program. Once awarded, the local department is required to report for a least the period of performance.

Public Fire & Life Safety Educator I | 24 hours (Friday-Sunday)

This course is based on NFPA 1035: Standard on Fire and Life Safety Educator, Public Information Officer, Youth Firesetter Intervention Specialist, and Youth Firesetter Program Manager Professional Qualifications and may lead to Pro Board Certification. The course is designed for the individual who will coordinate and deliver comprehensive community fire and injury prevention programs designed to eliminate or mitigate situations that endanger lives, health, property, or the environment. Campus Delivery Only. (Classes that are delivered either at the Alabama Fire College or an RTC or other area as approved by the Regional Coordinator and Training Staff at AFC.)

Rescue Technician: Rope Level II | 24 hours (Friday-Sunday)

This is a 3-day course that is based on NFPA 1006: Standard for Technical Rescue Personnel Professional Qualifications, and may lead to IFSAC and Pro Board certifications. The course is designed for those persons who respond to incidents involving the application of special knowledge, skills, and equipment to safely resolve unique or complex rescue situations. The course covers operations in a high angle environment including rescue of a suspended victim, serving as a litter tender, and construction/operation of a high line system.
